Wayzata Fishing Team 2022 Chemical Use Policy

The Wayzata Fishing Team program is adopting a Chemical Violation Policy and Handbook that all fishing team participants will be expected to abide by. We believe that being a part of the Wayzata Fishing Team family is a strong commitment to academic and community excellence and we all must share in that responsibility. Policy Effective as of May 1st, 2022: Any and all members of the Wayzata Fishing Team who violate the drug and chemical policy will follow the policies outlined below:

Policy: At any time during the Wayzata Fishing Team season, May 1st, 2022 - September 20, 2022 a student shall not, regardless of the quantity:

1. use or consume, have in possession a beverage containing alcohol;
2. use or consume, have in possession tobacco, electronic cigarettes or vaping products; or,
3. use or consume, have in possession, buy, sell or give away any other controlled substance or drug paraphernalia.
4. use or consume, have in possession, buy, sell or give away products containing or products used to deliver nicotine, tobacco products and other chemicals. "Tobacco products" means: any product containing, made, or derived from tobacco that is intended for human consumption, whether chewed, smoked, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, or any component, part or accessory of a tobacco product.
5. use or consume, have in possession, buy sell or give away any substance or product where the intent of such use of the substance or product is to induce intoxication, excitement, or stupefaction of the central nervous system, except under the direction and supervision of a medical doctor. Such substances or products shall include, but are not limited to, synthetic drugs, gasoline, glue, aerosol devices, bath salts, and any substances addressed by Minnesota or Federal Law.

Penalty:

First Violation Penalty: The student shall lose eligibility for the next two consecutive team events/tournaments or two weeks, 14 calendar days, whichever is greater, of a season in which the student is a participant.

Second Violation Penalty: The student shall lose eligibility for the next six consecutive team events/tournaments or three weeks, 21 calendar days, whichever is greater, in which the student is a participant.

Third or Subsequent Violation Penalty: The student shall lose eligibility for the next 12 consecutive team events/tournaments or four weeks, 28 calendar days, whichever is greater, in which the student is a participant.

Applying the Penalty: Parents are responsible for reporting any violations of this chemical policy to the Wayzata Fishing Team President.

Penalties shall be progressive beginning with the student's first violation and continuing throughout the student's high school career. Penalties shall be served consecutively.

Violation Confirmation Definition: The violation shall be confirmed when the Wayzata Fishing Team president has informed the student and parent that the student has violated the chemical policy and is now under the penalty. The notification shall be verbal and also in writing.

Counting Weeks: The weeks shall begin on the date that the violation is confirmed and extend for the required number of calendar days. The week starts the date the violation is confirmed, and the student/student's parents or guardians are notified

Denial Disqualification: A student shall be disqualified from all team events for nine additional weeks beyond the student's original period of ineligibility when the student denies violation of the rule, is allowed to participate and then is subsequently found guilty of the violation.

*** Suspended members may be asked to return jersey/team sweatshirt/buff to the board.
